

## How do I change the format in which dates in BatchWeb are displayed?

The format of dates and other regional presentation details is governed not by the Regional Settings of the user machine but by Internet Explorer internal Language Settings.

This will usually depend on the setting used when Internet Explorer was installed. This may be the default settings used when the Operating System itself was installed.

It can, however, be changed via the Internet Options applet. The Language setting can be different for each user of a machine. You can access the Internet Options applet from two locations:

- 1. From the Windows Control Panel
- 2. From the Tools Menu of Internet Explorer

In either case the dialogue displayed is the same (see above).



To change the Language click on the Language button which is at the bottom of the General tab. This displays the Language Preference dialogue (see below).

You can add any number of different Language settings but BatchWeb will only use the top entry when deciding what format to use.

BatchWeb will use the Language at the top of the list when configuring display formats. You move the language to the top of the list by selecting that Language and using the Move Up button.



If the Language you require is not already in the list then you can click on the Add button to display the Add Language dialogue (see below).
